### **Our Guest Speakers**

#### **Ann Ramsden**

Ann has personal experience of living with domestic abuse as a child. As an adult she has worked with children and young people for 23 years and the last 10 years with the family unit as a whole. Since 2009 she has developed, coordinated and delivered a multi-agency joint teen and parent group work programme; 'Do It Different' which is now delivered by the local authority. In 2005 Ann started to set up a charitable organisation and The Rosalie Ryrie Foundation opened in Wakefield in 2007. To date Ann has a Life Time Achievement Award for Local Hero, NVQ Hero Award, was one of the four finalists for Yorkshire Local Hero at the Pride of Britain awards 2012 and the foundation has just been awarded the Duke of York Community Initiative Award for 2016.

### **DS Ian Mitchell**

Ian Mitchell is a Detective Sergeant within the Bradford District Safeguarding Unit currently managing the Multi-Agency Safeguarding Hub. Ian has been a Police Officer for 18 years working in both uniform and investigative roles. He has worked in child protection for the last 6 years. Ian was instrumental in establishing the multi-agency working practices that are now employed across Bradford district and West Yorkshire.

#### **Susan Tinnion**

Sue Tinnion qualified as a social worker in 1999, she has worked in child protection in Bradford since this time. She has held various roles including Team Manager and Care Proceedings Case Manager. Sue is currently the Service Manager for Bradford Multi-agency Safeguarding Hub. Sue leads for the Multi-Safeguarding Hub on a number of safeguarding areas such as domestic abuse and honour based violence, human trafficking and modern slavery, radicalisation and extremism, FGM and CSE. Sue has been instrumental in developing working practices to ensure safeguarding is embedded in these areas.
