The General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR)

On May 25 2018, the Data Protection Act 1998 will be replaced by the EU General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR), making changes to how your organisation should process data.

Organisations will now be required to:



- 1. Give clear notification of each purpose for which they may use data.
- 2. Notify the data subject of organisations with whom they may need to share their data.




- 3. Get explicit consent to process data.
- 4. Obtain consent from parents or guardians to process children's data.



- 5. Evidence how they got consent, what was agreed and what the data would be used for.
- 6. Allow data subjects to be forgotten.



- Remove the subject access fee and respond to requests within 30 days.
- 8. Put measures in place so their systems respect the privacy of the data subject.



- 9. Pay €20 million or 4% of global turnover for a breach of the GDPR.
- 10. Report more breaches to the ICO.

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
